#### Childcare Resources Training and Registration Policies

#### **Training Policies**





The *Alabama Early Learning Guidelines* (AELG) professional development course, through a partnership with the Alabama Department of Human Resources, Alabama Public Television and the Alabama State Department of Education, will be offered online again this quarter.

The course begins Monday, January 6, 2020 and ends Monday, February 24, 2020.

The *Alabama Early Learning Guidelines* were developed by DHR to promote continuity of high quality care and learning for children ages 0-5. The *AELG* online course will consist of 7 training sessions (two sessions are combined) with readings, activities and online discussions that will be a guide for understanding child development and learning, and for implementing the best practices in order to prepare children for success in school and in life.

Participants who complete the course will receive 18 workshop training hours and a Training Award Credential issued by the Alabama Department of Human Resources. (If you have received this credential through the AELG face-to-face training, you will not receive credit for the online version of the course.)

#### **AELG Guidelines Course Descriptions**

The Alabama Early Learning Guidelines (AELG) are a guide to the building blocks necessary to prepare each child for their future in school and life and they are intended to be inclusive for all children. AELG is a result of a collaboration between the Alabama Department of Human Resources (DHR) and various stakeholders across the state.

#### The AELG consist of nine modules:

- 1. **Orientation**: This session will involve learners in activities to become familiar with the AELG course and basic child development concepts. It will explain the origin and the purpose of AELG, list the sessions included and help learners develop a basic understanding of concepts and terminology related to child development.
- 2. **Observation**: This session will involve learners in activities to understand the critical importance of child observations. It will identify the purpose of intentional child observations, children's learning styles and will demonstrate techniques of observing and reflecting on children, and how to complete a developmental checklist.
- 3. The Role of Parent and Caregiver: This session will involve learners in activities to help facilitate positive relationships between parents and caregivers. The session will help learners become familiar with ways to help start, build and maintain positive relationships when children are in out-of-home care and learn how to set a positive tone for a partnership between parents and caregivers.
- 4. **Self-concept and Emotional Development**: This session will engage learners in activities that can be used to help children develop a positive picture of self, understand and express their emotions. Learners will also use AELG to help children build self-esteem, identify and name their emotions and regulate behaviors.

- 5. **Social Development:** This session will engage learners in activities that can be used to help children enhance their social interaction skills, identify strategies to help children develop trusting relationships with nurturing adults, demonstrate caring cooperation and role play relationship dynamics.
- 6. Language and Literacy: This session will teach learners to stimulate and enhance children's communication skills. It will engage learners in using AELG to understand verbal and non-verbal communication, explore various methods of communication, identify with home languages, and become familiar with ages and stages of language and literacy development.
- 7. **Physical Development**: This session will teach learners to stimulate and enhance children's physical skills necessary for healthy development. Learners will engage in becoming familiar with how children develop gross and fine motor skills and ways to enhance self-help skills.
- 8. **Cognitive Development**: This session will engage learners in activities that can be used to help children build and expand concepts to develop problem-solving skills. Learners will gain an understanding of basic concepts and relationships, apply knowledge to new situations and problem solving.
- 9. **Putting It all Together**: This session will have learners participate in activities that encourage the use of all available resources for caregivers, families and children. The session will help participants provide additional resources and materials to parents to promote high quality care and education and pull together information from previous AELG sessions.



Note: You MUST attend the Orientation Session first in order to attend sessions 2-9. Upon completion of each session you will receive a certificate. When all 9 sessions have been completed you will receive a Credential from the Alabama Department of Human Resources.
